Release 221 of *Moore's Federal Practice* features analysis of the lat-

est caselaw and other developments pertaining to federal civil and appellate practice, including the following:

Federal Tort Claims Act. The Third Circuit, in *Wilson v. United States*, 79 F.4th 312 (3d Cir. 2023), held that although a state's certificate-of-merit requirement applies to a malpractice claim against a private actor in a diversity action, it does not apply in a Federal Tort Claims Act action against the federal government. *See Ch. 1, Scope and Purpose, § 1.05[2][b].*

Americans With Disabilities Act. In *Israelitt v. Enter. Servs. LLC*, 78 F.4th 647 (4th Cir. 2023), the Fourth Circuit ruled that because only equitable relief is available under the Americans with Disabilities Act, a plaintiff does not have a right to a jury trial on a retaliation claim under the Act. *See Ch. 2, One Form of Action, § 2.06[1].*

Amendment of Pleadings as Mat-

ter of Course. In *Carmouche v. Hooper*, 77 F.4th 362 (5th Cir. 2023), the Fifth Circuit ruled that a plaintiff had the right to amend the formal complaint once as a matter of course, even though the district clerk had erroneously docketed a pre-complaint letter to the court as an initial complaint. *See Ch. 3, Commencing an Action, §§ 3.02[1], 3.04[4]; Ch. 15, Amended and Supplemental Pleadings, § 15.10[2], [3].*

Statutes of Limitations. The Second Circuit, in *Kane v. Mount Pleasant Cent. Sch. Dist.*, 80 F.4th 101 (2d Cir. 2023), held that when borrowed state law provides the general limitations period, a state law extending the period for certain favored tort claimants, or reviving certain tort claims after expiration of the period, does not affect the proper timing of a federal claim, because federal courts borrow only the general statute of limitations from state law. *See Ch. 3, Commencing an Action, § 3.05[2][b].*

Partial in Forma Pauperis Status. In *Hymas v. United States DOI*, 73 F.4th 763 (9th Cir. 2023), the Ninth Circuit held that district courts have the authority to grant partial in forma pauperis status and accept reduced filing fees from non-prisoner civil litigants. *See Ch. 4, Summons, § 4.40[1].*

Referral to Magistrate Judge. The Third Circuit, in *Prater v. Dep’t of Corr.*, 76 F.4th 184 (3d Cir. 2023), held that an application to proceed in forma pauperis is a nondispositive pretrial matter that can be referred to

a magistrate judge without the applicant’s consent, and any denial by the magistrate judge must first be challenged in the district court before it can be appealed to the court of appeals. *See Ch. 4, Summons, § 4.40[1].*

Sealing of Documents. In *Abelar v. IBM (In re IBM Arb. Agreement Litig.)*, 76 F.4th 74 (2d Cir. 2023), the Second Circuit held that the district court properly granted the defendant’s motion to seal, because the presumption of public access to judicial documents was outweighed by the Federal Arbitration Act’s strong policy in favor of enforcing confidentiality provisions in an arbitration agreement. *See Ch. 5, Serving and Filing Pleadings and Other Papers, § 5.34[1][a].*

Time for Answer After Default Is Set Aside. In *United States v. Starling*, 76 F.4th 92 (2d Cir. 2023), the Second Circuit held that when an entry of default is set aside for good cause under Rule 55(c), the defending party need not also show excusable neglect under Rule 6(b) to secure an extension of time to respond to the claim. *See Ch. 6, Computing and Extending Time; Time for Motion Papers, § 6.06[4].*

Rule 11 Sanctions. In *Kezhaya v. City of Belle Plaine*, 78 F.4th 1045 (8th Cir. 2023), the Eighth Circuit ruled that when a party prevails on a sanctions motion under Rule 11, the fact that attorney’s fees or other expenses incurred were actually paid by an insurer rather than by the movant does not bar their inclusion in the court’s award of expenses. *See Ch.*

11, *Signing Pleadings, Motions, and Other Papers; Representations to the Court; Sanctions*, §§ 11.22[1][f], 11.24[1], [3].

Forum-Selection Clauses. In *Rabinowitz v. Kelman*, 75 F.4th 73 (2d Cir. 2023), the Second Circuit held that the district court erred in dismissing an action to confirm an arbitration award based on a contractual forum-selection clause that limited such an action to state court. *See Ch. 12, Defenses and Objections: When and How Presented; Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings; Consolidating Motions; Waiving Defenses; Pretrial Hearing*, §§ 12.30[1]; 12.32[1]; Ch. 15, *Amended and Supplemental Pleadings*, § 15.19[2].

Treatment of Dismissal Motion as One for Summary Judgment. The Ninth Circuit, in *Jones v. L.A. Cent. Plaza LLC*, 74 F.4th 1053 (9th Cir. 2023), ruled that when the parties have engaged in extensive discovery and filed summary-judgment motions and oppositions, the district court may not disregard those materials and decide instead that the allegations of the complaint do not plausibly allege a basis for federal jurisdiction, because that would be a prohibited “reverse conversion” of a summary-judgment motion into a pleadings motion. *See Ch. 12, Defenses and Objections: When and How Presented; Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings; Consolidating Motions; Waiving Defenses; Pretrial Hearing*, §§ 12.30[4]; 12.34[3][a].

Amendment of Pleadings—Right to Amend. The Tenth Circuit, in *Česká zbrojovka Defence SE v. Vista Outdoor, Inc.*, 79 F.4th 1255 (10th Cir. 2023), held that a nonparty may not amend the pleading of a party. *See Ch. 15, Amended and Supplemental Pleadings*, §§ 15.02[1], 15.16[1].

Sanctions for Multiplying Proceedings. In *Vaughan v. Lewisville Indep. Sch. Dist.*, 62 F.4th 199 (5th Cir. 2023), the Fifth Circuit joined the majority of other circuits in holding that 28 U.S.C. § 1927, which authorizes sanctions against an attorney who unreasonably and vexatiously multiplies proceedings, does not provide grounds for a district court to award attorney’s fees against law firms or other entities not admitted to practice law. *See Ch. 26, Duty to Disclose, General Provisions Governing Discovery*, § 26.06[3].

Expert Report from Treating Physician. In *Johnson v. Friesen*, 79 F.4th 939 (8th Cir. 2023), the Eighth Circuit held that a treating physician who offered to provide expert testimony as to causation, and who did not make that determination during the course of providing treatment, should be deemed “retained or specially employed,” and must submit an expert report in compliance with Rule 26(a)(2). *See Ch. 26, Duty to Disclose, General Provisions Governing Discovery*, § 26.23[2][b].

Disclosures by Expert Witness. In *Cedant v. United States*, 75 F.4th 1314 (11th Cir. 2023), the Eleventh Circuit held that the initial reason an

expert was hired is crucial to determining whether the expert was retained or specially employed to provide expert testimony and must provide the detailed expert report required by Rule 26(a)(2)(B); thus, experts initially hired to treat the plaintiff rather than to testify need provide only the less burdensome disclosures of Rule 26(a)(2)(C). *See Ch. 26, Duty to Disclose, General Provisions Governing Discovery, § 26.23[2][b].*

Spoliation of Electronically Stored Information. In *Skanska USA Civ. Se. Inc. v. Bagelheads, Inc.*, 75 F.4th 1290 (11th Cir. 2023), a case of first impression, the Eleventh Circuit held that the “intent to deprive” standard required to impose the most serious sanctions for spoliation of electronically stored information is the same as the “bad faith” standard applied in other spoliation contexts; “bad faith” generally means destruction of evidence for the purpose of hiding adverse evidence and requires more than negligence or even gross negligence. *See Ch. 37, Failure to Make Disclosures or to Cooperate in Discovery; Sanctions, § 37.121A.*

Vacating Voluntary Dismissals. Citing a conflict with the Third, Fifth, and Seventh Circuits, the Tenth Circuit in *Waetzig v. Halliburton Energy Servs., Inc.*, 82 F.4th 918 (10th Cir. 2023), held that while Rule 60(b) may be available to vacate a Rule 41(a)(1) voluntary dismissal with prejudice, a district court cannot use Rule 60(b) to vacate a plaintiff’s Rule 41(a)(1)(A) voluntary dismissal with-

out prejudice, because it is not a final judgment, order, or proceeding. *See Ch. 41, Dismissal of Actions, § 41.33[6][f]; Ch. 60, Relief From a Judgment or Order, § 60.23.*

Voluntary Dismissal by Stipulation. In *Sanchez v. Disc. Rock & Sand, Inc.*, 84 F.4th 1283 (11th Cir. 2023), the Eleventh Circuit held that all parties who have appeared in an action must sign a stipulation of voluntary dismissal, not just the defendants being dismissed. *See Ch. 41, Dismissal of Actions, § 41.34[4][b].*

Timing of Notice of Intent to Raise Issue of Foreign Law. In *Rey v. GM, LLC*, 76 F.4th 1125 (8th Cir. 2023), the Eighth Circuit acknowledged that timeliness is implicated by Rule 44.1, governing issues of foreign law, and the fact that notice of intent to raise an issue of foreign law could have been provided earlier in the proceedings may weigh against a finding of timeliness, but there is no hardline rule that notice must be provided as early as practicable. *See Ch. 44.1, Determining Foreign Law, § 44.1.03[3]. [4].*

Costs Under Rule 54. In *Garcia v. Gateway Hotel L.P.*, 82 F.4th 750 (9th Cir. 2023), the Ninth Circuit held that although the Americans With Disabilities Act requires that a plaintiff’s action be frivolous, unreasonable, or without foundation for the prevailing defendant to obtain an attorney’s fee award, that standard does not apply to a discretionary award of costs under Rule 54(d)(1). *See Ch. 54, Judgment; Costs, § 54.101[1][c].*

Attorney's Fees—Prevailing Party. The Fourth Circuit, in *Stinnie v. Holcomb*, 77 F.4th 200 (4th Cir. 2023) (en banc), held that when a preliminary injunction provides the plaintiff concrete, irreversible relief on the merits, but becomes moot before final judgment because no further court-ordered assistance proves necessary, the mooted of the case does not bar prevailing-party status or an award of attorney's fees to the plaintiff. *See Ch. 54, Judgment; Costs, § 54.171[3][c].*

Attorney's Fees Under Americans With Disabilities Act. In *Fernandez v. 23676–23726 Malibu Rd., LLC*, 74 F.4th 1061 (9th Cir. 2023), the Ninth Circuit held that when an Americans with Disabilities Act claim is dismissed because the plaintiff does not have Article III standing, the district court likewise lacks jurisdiction to award attorney's fees to the defendant under the Act's fee-shifting provision. *See Ch. 54, Judgment; Costs, § 54.171[3][c].*

Admissible Rule 406 Evidence at Summary-Judgment Stage. In *First Floor Living LLC v. City of Cleveland*, 83 F.4th 445 (6th Cir. 2023), the Sixth Circuit held that, at the summary-judgment stage, courts may consider admissible Rule 406 evidence of an organization's routine practice to infer that that practice was carried out. *See Ch. 56, Summary Judgment, §§ 56.91[1], 56.100[1].*

Appealability of Declaratory Decree. The Third Circuit, in *Zenith Ins. Co. v. Newell*, 78 F.4th 603 (3d Cir. 2023), held that a declaratory decree

that leaves other claims for relief unresolved is not subject to interlocutory appeal as an order having the practical effect of an injunction if it simply declares the parties' rights and obligations without directing a party to do anything. *See Ch. 57, Declaratory Judgment, § 57.100; Ch. 203, Interlocutory Orders, § 203.10[2][a],*

Effect of Postjudgment Motion on Previously Filed Notice of Appeal. In *Matney v. Barrick Gold of N. Am.*, 80 F.4th 1136 (10th Cir. 2023), the Tenth Circuit lacked jurisdiction to consider the district court's denial of the plaintiff's Rule 59(e) motion filed one day before the plaintiff filed a timely notice of appeal from the district court's order dismissing the case, because the plaintiff did not amend the notice of appeal or file a new one. *See Ch. 59, New Trial; Altering or Amending a Judgment, § 59.33.*

Rule 60(b)(5) and Consent Decrees. In *Chisom v. Louisiana ex rel. Landry*, 85 F.4th 288 (5th Cir. 2023), the Fifth Circuit noted that the satisfaction, release, or discharge clause of Rule 60(b)(5) is almost never applied to consent decrees and is typically reserved for disputes involving the amount of a judgment. *See Ch. 60, Relief From a Judgment or Order, §§ 60.45, 60.47[2][b], [c].*

Disqualification of Magistrate Judges. In *IFG Port Holdings, L.L.C. v. Lake Charles Harbor & Terminal Dist.*, 82 F.4th 402 (5th Cir. 2023), the Fifth Circuit explained that even if a potential source of bias

is not enough to overcome the presumption of impartiality on the part of a magistrate judge who has been designated to conduct a trial, it may still serve as a basis to vacate the district court's referral of the matter to the magistrate if nondisclosure of the potential source of bias casts doubt on the validity of a party's consent to the referral. *See Ch. 63, Judge's Inability to Proceed, § 63.20[8][b].*

Standing. In *Doe v. Univ. of Mich.*, 78 F.4th 929 (6th Cir. 2023), the Sixth Circuit found that a student had standing for a due-process claim against state university that placed a hold on his transcript without a hearing, but not on his due-process claims challenging the university's decision-making process and disciplinary procedure for adjudicating sexual misconduct claims, noting a plaintiff must demonstrate standing for each claim, because standing is not dispensed in gross. *See Ch. 101, Issues of Justiciability, §§ 101.20, 101.60[2][b], 101.71, 101.99[2]; Ch. 134, Stare Decisis, Law of the Case, and Judicial Estoppel, § 134.21[1].*

Removal. The Second, Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth Circuits, in *Solomon v. St. Joseph Hosp.*, 62 F.4th 54 (2d Cir. 2023), *Hudak v. Elmcroft of Sagamore Hills*, 58 F.4th 845 (6th Cir. 2023), *Martin v. Petersen Health Operations, LLC*, 37 F.4th 1210 (7th Cir. 2022), and *Cagle v. NHC Healthcare-Maryland Heights, LLC*, 78 F.4th 1061 (8th Cir. 2023), held that the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act does not

completely preempt state-law negligence claims for COVID-19-related deaths and injuries, and that nursing homes following COVID-19 protocols were not acting under a federal officer for purposes of federal-officer removal. *See Ch. 103, Federal Question Jurisdiction, § 103.45[3][g]; Ch. 107, Removal, §§ 107.75[14], 107.100][4][b].*

Foreign Sovereign Immunities

Act. In *Bartlett v. Baasiri*, 81 F.4th 28 (2d Cir. 2023), the Second Circuit held that immunity under the Foreign Sovereign Immunities Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1604, can attach when a bank becomes an instrumentality of a foreign sovereign *after* suit is filed. *See Ch. 104, Specific Grants of Federal Question Jurisdiction, § 104.11[4].*

Anti-Injunction Act—Necessary-in-Aid-of-Jurisdiction Exception.

The Tenth Circuit, in *Quint v. Vail Resorts, Inc.*, 84 F.4th 918 (10th Cir. 2023), determined that the necessary-in-aid-of-jurisdiction exception to the Anti-Injunction Act did not apply, because the back wages sought did not make the case an in-rem or quasi-in-rem action. *See Ch. 121, The Anti-Injunction Acts, § 121.07[2][d], [e].*

Eleventh Amendment—Fair Labor Standards Act Claims. In *Austin v. Glynn County*, 80 F.4th 1342 (11th Cir. 2023), the Eleventh Circuit concluded that a local sheriff was entitled to Eleventh Amendment immunity in a Fair Labor Standards Act action challenging the calculation of overtime wages. *See Ch. 123, Access to Courts: Eleventh Amendment and State Sovereign Immunity,*

§ 123.23[4][b][iv].

Eleventh Amendment—

Executive Orders. The Fifth Circuit, in *United States v. Abbott*, 85 F.4th 328 (5th Cir. 2023), held that the *Ex parte Young* exception to Eleventh Amendment immunity did not apply to a suit seeking to enjoin the governor from enforcing an executive order, because there was no nexus between issuance of the executive order and the ability or intent to enforce it. *See Ch. 123, Access to Courts: Eleventh Amendment and State Sovereign Immunity*, § 123.40[3][a][v].

Recognition of Judgments. The Eighth Circuit, in *Nygaard v. Taylor*, 78 F.4th 995, 999–1002 (8th Cir. 2023), held that Indian tribes are not subject to the Parental Kidnapping Prevention Act’s requirement that state authorities enforce child-custody and visitation determinations “by a court of another State,” 28 U.S.C. § 1738A(a). *See Ch. 130, Recognition and Validity of Judgments*, § 130.01.

Federal Circuit Practice. The Federal Circuit, in *Purdue Pharma L.P. v. Collegium Pharm., Inc.*, 86 F.4th 1338 (Fed. Cir. 2023), held that mandamus is the appropriate remedy when the Patent Trial and Appeal Board fails to act by the one-year deadline (plus a six-month extension, if appropriate) for post-grant patent review established by 35 U.S.C. § 326(a)(11) and 37 C.F.R. § 42.200(c). *See Ch. 208, Practice in the Federal Circuit*, § 208.02.

Appeals in Bankruptcy Cases. In *Kiviti v. Bhatt*, 80 F.4th 520 (4th Cir.

2023), the Fourth Circuit ruled that the parties to an adversary proceeding in a bankruptcy case cannot convert a partial dismissal into a final order by voluntarily dismissing the remaining claims without prejudice. *See Ch. 306, Appeal in a Bankruptcy Case*, § 306.02.

Proceeding in Forma Pauperis—

Prison Litigation Reform Act. The Ninth Circuit, in *Meyers v. Birdsong*, 83 F.4th 1157 (9th Cir. 2023), explained that a prisoner whose leave to proceed in forma pauperis on appeal is revoked because of three or more previous dismissals that constituted “strikes” under the Prison Litigation Reform Act has the option of timely paying the full filing fee or electing not to proceed with the appeal. *See Ch. 324, Proceeding in Forma Pauperis*, § 324.11.

Forfeiture of Arguments on Appeal. In *L.C. v. United States*, 83 F.4th 534 (6th Cir. 2023), the Sixth Circuit pointed out that, when a party in an appeal is faced with an argument that has been forfeited, the party must preemptively point that out at the first briefing opportunity; waiting until oral argument will “forfeit the forfeiture.” *See Ch. 328, Briefs*, §§ 328.20[8], 328.21.

Interest on Judgment. The Fifth Circuit, in *Carmichael v. Balke (In re Imperial Petroleum Recovery Corp.)*, 84 F.4th 264 (5th Cir. 2023), held that 28 U.S.C. § 1961(a), which provides for interest on a “money judgment in a civil case recovered in a district court,” applies to a bankruptcy court’s judgment in an adver-

sary proceeding. *See* Ch. 337, *Interest on Judgment*, § 337.02.

Supreme Court Justices. The Supreme Court has adopted the CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED

STATES, which includes provisions addressing the disqualification and recusal of Justices. *See* Ch. 401, *Organization and Operation of Supreme Court*, § 401.03[2A].
